Universiti Tenaga Nasional (UNITEN) is among the nine Malaysian universities listed in the Times Higher Education (THE) University Impact Rankings 2019. The result is based on our performance against the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), where THE used carefully calibrated indicators mapped to 11 SDGs to provide comprehensive and balanced comparisons across three broad areas: research, outreach, and stewardship. The 17 goals were adopted by the United Nations in 2015 and provide a framework for developing the world in a sustainable way, with minimum impact on the environment and inclusive in the processes. Three top SDG for UNITEN are : Responsible consumption and production, Industry, innovation and infrastructure, Climate action and Partnerships for the goals. There are more than 550 universities from among 27,000 universities around the world which were selected to participate and being short-listed. This ranking is THE's pioneering initiative to recognise universities across the world for their social and economic impact, based on the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals.
